- Gym Sound System: We actually rarely even use our sound system in the gym any more because it's so poor. Our ASB has purchased portable speakers that we bring in for events and assemblies. We had a quote done a few years ago and it was around \$15,000.

- Complete Outdoor Therapeutic Space for Living Skills: living skills classroom, which are our students with disabilities, for an outdoor therapeutic space for them to access. We would like to add some equipment for them to utilize for PE and other activities. We have a quote for an appropriate swing and surface that was approximately \$10,000.

- Scholarships for Low Income Students: we used to have a private donor who provided \$5000 dollars for us to access for students who are having financial difficulties with a wide variety of items. In the past, the Haller Grant provided items for students and families who are struggling financially. The following items are things that we helped families with: ASB cards, PE uniforms, pay to participate costs for sports and clubs, graduation assistance, choir and band fees, and senior ball tickets for some examples. \$5000.

- Kids At Hope: our school will officially be a Kids at Hope school next year. We sent a team of teachers to Arizona for one week training and we will be embarking on creating a culture of hope by highlighting these three universal truths; Believe, Connect, and Time Travel. Believe—all students are capable of success, NO EXCEPTIONS. Connect—every student at SHS will have at least one adult who has a personal connection with them. Time Travel—we will work with our students to have them see the possibilities of their future and set goals for the following areas: home and family, hobbies and recreation, community and service, and education and career. We want to purchase signage and other materials as we kick this endeavor off. We are budgeting about \$4000 dollars for our initial cost. The financial assistance for kids at Hope and our newly formed Hope Academy would entail the following as well: furniture and equipment for the program, technology, curriculum for the Hope Academy, conferences and training for staff members are a few of the things that would be beneficial for our Hope Academy. \$4000-\$8000.

- Courtyard upgrade: one of our leadership students is doing a service project where she is designing a new, improved student courtyard between our science building in the back of the library. This could be the potential work party and approximately \$2000 dollars for supplies and equipment.
