



Goal: Read EVERY DAY! Need to know where to start? Begin with reading 15-20 minutes.

#### Bingo Sheets are due by Friday, March 1

Every box completed counts as a point. Complete as many blackouts (marking off every box) as you can! Each blackout sheet handed is entered in a drawing for an individual prize. The class from each grade with the most points earns a class reading prize. Even if you don't have a blackout, still turn in your sheet so it can add to class points!
